Thank Goodness It's Fall!



It truly is the best time of year, the air is crisp, the leaves are changing color, there's nothing quite like it!

With the pond and water season behind us, we'll be restructuring the Pond Committee in the coming months. Our goal is to lessen the burden on our volunteers and rely more on our property manager and vendors. This new structure will allow committee members to focus on identifying issues that may arise, rather than being responsible for repairs or maintenance themselves.

One of the key concerns in our community right now is the health of our trees. We've developed an ongoing relationship with Jacob Weber, an arborist and owner of Trees All Day and Tree Service. Over the summer, he removed dead trees, assessed their health, and provided recommendations for preventive care. Many trees were improperly planted, which has led to growth issues and deterioration over time. You may have seen him recently performing root collar excavation to help revive some of our trees and extend their lifespan. In the spring, he'll return to assess which ones need pruning. Investing in our trees' health is a long-term commitment that will help preserve them and reduce future costs for replacements.

The Board has also been working closely with our property manager, Doug, to develop the budget for 2025. While we have adequate funds, we are mindful to ensure that we're making responsible spending decisions to benefit the community while continuing to build our reserves.

As part of this, we're currently updating our Reserve Study to better prepare for future needs.

And no worries—our trees and clubhouse will be adorned with Christmas lights this holiday season! We've reached out to several companies within our budget and found one that meets Heron River's needs. This year, we're trying a new look and look forward to hearing your feedback for the 2026 holiday season. Lights will start going up around mid-November.

I also hope everyone gets a chance to enjoy the upcoming events our tireless Social Committee have planned for the next couple of months. They work hard to create a variety of events that appeal to many interests, and we want to thank them for their time and effort in providing us with opportunities to gather and participate throughout the year.

Personally, this has been a big learning year for me on the Board. It's true—you're never too old to learn new things, though it can be a bit tiring! Serving on the Board has allowed me to meet homeowners I may not have otherwise met, it reminded me how much I enjoy the challenges of working, and how much I enjoy meeting and building relationships with vendors and city workers. All in all, it's been a good year, and I feel fortunate for the opportunity to serve on the Heron River Board.

Thank you Kelley for getting this event together!










