Summer Pool Season 2017

It was a warm summer and many of our members enjoyed the pool for fun as well as exercise. BBQs were had, and a few children's birthday parties used the Community Center and pool for celebrations.

The waterfalls had two basins running which provided the sound of falling water to the experience of being at the pool. Next year, we have plans to have all three basins running.

This year's pool committee of twelve volunteers did a fabulous job of making the pool a great place to spend some time.

One surprise was the visit of a bird who decided to swim and sunbath with us. This Double-Crested Cormorant *Phalacrocorax auritus* spend 16 hours swimming in the Heron River Community Center pool.



Idaho Fish and Wildlife told us the bird is a protected species, so we could not endanger it when asking it to leave. Many suggestions were made on ways to ask it to leave.

On August 1, a group of swimmers yelled and splashed in the water while others tapped the aluminum net pole on the pool bottom. The Cormorant seemed to enjoy the attention, swam among the humans, and did not leave.

Eventually, the Cormorant flew over to the nearby pond where apparently it found the fishing more rewarding.



The team from The Pool Doctor put the covers back on our pools after they winterized the pumps and lines once the pool was closed on September 10.

Sports Court Update

Residents have organized pickle ball teams that play frequently on one end of the tennis courts with a portable net, but the Sports Court continues the fund-raising process.

Heron River Bird Watching

Our Heron River subdivision provides ideal bird watching opportunities for residents with its riparian areas along our boundary with the Boise River as well as our canals and ponds.

Kathy Engel generously provided THE HERON with some her beautiful bird photographs she has taken in Heron River.

Kathy uses a bird book and keeps a list of the new bird species she sees, but does not consider herself an avid birder. Her interest began many years ago when she became an avid kayaker and found the wonderful world of birds went hand in hand with paddling her kayak.



The Great Blue Heron *Adrea Herodias* hunts for fish, frogs, snakes, insects, voles and small water birds in shallow water or on grasslands by remaining stationary until it strikes with its beak at lightning speed.

The Osprey *Pandion haliaetus* breeds in North American including Southwestern Idaho and they migrate from Central and South America. They build large stick nests, mate for life and are devoted parents. Young are full grown at six weeks and leave the nest at eight to ten weeks of age when they take their first flight.

The Belted Kingfisher *Megaceryle alcyon* is dimorphic meaning the males and females do not look alike. This is a male Belted Kingfisher which lacks a rust-colored "belt" below the white "belt" of the females. The male bird feather patterns are more colorful than females, but the female Belted Kingfisher is one exception with her rust-colored belt! Photo by Kathy Engel.
